

The details of the latter day invasion in Dan. 11:40-45 are identical to the details in Ezek. 38

1. Both invasions occur **in the same time period** = at the time of the end
 - Ezek 38 = in the latter years, in the latter days (v8,16)
 - Daniel 11 = the time of the end (v40)
2. **Israel** is the nation invaded in both prophecies
 - Ezek = upon the mountains of Israel, the land of Israel, my people Israel (v8,14,16,18)
 - Daniel = he shall enter into the glorious land (v41); the glorious mountain (Zion) (v45)
3. The invader is described identically: comprised of **a huge, conquering army**
 - Ezek = “all thine army, horses + horsemen; a great company, many people w/ thee, a mighty army” (38:4,15)
 - Daniel = “with chariots and with horsemen” (v40)
4. The invader is described as **moving at a devastating speed, mounting an overwhelming attack**
 - Ezek = “like a storm to cover the land” (v9)
 - Daniel = “like a whirlwind” (v40)
5. The conquering army **comes out of the north**
 - Ezek = from thy place out of the north (rsv: uttermost parts of the north) (38:6,15; 39:2)
 - Daniel = the king of the north (v40)
6. The northern invader is **confederate with the same allies**: Ethiopia and Libya (38:5 + 11:43)
7. The **motivation is for attack is financial gain**, riches and wealth
 - Ezek = to take a spoil (v12); to carry away silver and gold, cattle and goods (v13)
 - Daniel = he seeks gold and silver and the precious things of Egypt (v43)
8. The invader **enjoys killing Jews**
 - Ezek = has an evil thought (v10); seeks to take a prey (v12) [Heb for “prey” = people 3 times in Ezek 34]
 - Daniel = “he shall go forth with great fury to destroy and to make away many” (v44)
9. The invading army is **miraculously destroyed** by divine intervention
 - Ezek = “I will call for a sword against him...I will plead against him (vv21-22)
 - Daniel = “at that time shall Michael stand up, the great prince (12:1)
10. The invader’s **destruction occurs in the same location**
 - Ezek = upon the mountains of Israel (39:4)
 - Daniel = in the land of Israel (“between the seas and the glorious holy mountain”) (11:45)

Conclusion: Both Ezekiel 38 and Daniel 11 describe the same battle, occurring at the same time, by the same enemy, who suffers the same destruction, at the same place
