Anna the Prophetess

"Anna, a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, and had lived with an husband seven years from her virginity; and she was a widow of about fourscore and four years, which departed not from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day." Lk. 2:36

Anna the Prophetess

"A Prophetess"

Ex. 15:20 Miriam the prophetess dances & sings to celebrate the salvation of Israel

Jg. 4:4, 5:1 Deborah the prophetess sang an epic song to celebrate when Israel was delivered 1 Ch. 25:1 The Temple Singers' role was to prophecy through music

1 Ch. 9:33 The Temple singers were on duty day and night.

Departed Not From the Temple

Anna the Prophetess

Departed Not From the Temple

Es. 4:16 The Jews fasted night and day for their redemption

Ne. 1:6 Nehemiah asks for God's ears to be open day & night to prayer about Jerusalem

Psa. 22:3,8 Jesus cried to God day & night

1 Ti. 5:5 'Widows indeed' who are desolate but trust in God must continue in supplications and prayers night and Day.

Looking for Redemption

"Those who look for Redemption"

Lk. 2:25 - Simeon waited for the consolation of Israel

Mk. 15:43 – Joseph of Aramathea waited for the kingdom of God

Matt. 11:3 – John the Baptist asked if Jesus was the one who would come, or if he should look for someone else.

Lk 24:21 - Disciples thought Jesus would redeem Israel

Looking for Redemption

Isa. 62:6-7,11-12

On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have set watchmen; all the day and all the night they shall never be silent. You who put the LORD in remembrance, take no rest, and give him no rest until he establishes Jerusalem and makes it a praise in the earth. Behold, the LORD has proclaimed to the end of the earth: Say to the daughter of Zion, "Behold, your salvation comes; behold, his reward is with him, and his recompense before him." And they shall be called The Holy People, The Redeemed of the LORD; and you shall be called Sought Out, A City Not Forsaken.

The Widow of Nain

"And it came to pass the day after, that he went into a city called Nain; and many of his disciples went with him, and much people. Now when he came nigh to the gate of the city, behold, there was a dead man carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow: and much people of the city was with her." LR. 7:11–12

God Visits His People

"And they glorified God, saying, That a great prophet is risen up among us; and, That God hath **visited** his people." **Lk. 7:16**

"Visited" – Thayer

G1980: ἐπισκέπτομαι (episkeptomai)

To look upon or after, to inspect, examine with the eyes

1a) in order to see how he is, i.e. to visit, go to see... the poor and afflicted, the sick

1b) to look upon in order to help or to benefit, to look after, have care for, provide for

1c) to look (about) for, look out (one to choose, employ, etc.)

"Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To **visit** the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world.

Ja. 1:27

The Poor Widow

"And he looked up, and saw the rich men casting their gifts into the treasury. And he saw also a certain poor widow casting in thither two mites. And he said, Of a truth I say unto you, that this poor widow hath cast in more than they all: For all these have of their abundance cast in unto the offerings of God: but she of her penury hath cast in all the living that she had."

Lk. 21:1-4

Context

The Daughter of Zion welcomes her King...

Luke 19:28-40 (Matt. 21:4-5 Isa. 62:11, Zech. 9:9)

...But he weeps because she "did not know the time of her visitation."

The Widow's Adversaries

"There was a there was in a city a judge, which feared not God, neither regarded man: And there was a widow in that city; and she came unto him, saying, Avenge me of mine adversary...

And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them? I tell you that he will avenge them speedily."

The Widow's Adversaries

Lk. 18:1–8 – Parable of the Persistent Widow

"There was a there was in a city a judge, which feared not God, neither regarded man: And there was a widow in that city; and she came unto him, saying, Avenge me of mine adversary...

And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them? I tell you that he will avenge them speedily."

The Pharisees & Scribes made the temple a den of thieves.

The Widows made it a house of prayer.

"Living" – Strongs

G979: βίος (Bios) "life, that is, (literally) the present state of existence; by implication the means of livelihood:"

1 Jn. 3:17 (ESV) "But if anyone has the world's goods (G979) and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?"

The Widow's Might
